I am very proud to say that I trained him. Since 2010 I've trained about 31 drivers, averaging about 10 drivers per year. The trainers program works so much better now. We go through classroom material, step by step procedures, mentoring, delivering, rack rules, evaluating, focusing, emergencies, carding and the driver job duties. Our Scheduling, Dispatch and Compliance Departments have been able to get very involved with loading, carding and the work flow. It's a learning process to acquire the knowledge to be a trainer and you have to have the enthusiasm to make drivers successful. I enjoy being responsible, having knowledge, relationships and working with people. The trainers program also makes me good money. Most other companies hire drivers on and only do a 3-4 hour orientation to put them on a truck. We train for almost an entire month because safety is a core value of Pacific Tank Lines. Almost every new driver that has been hired on has told me how surprised and happy they are to go through such an educative training process. Now with the new retention and mentoring program, it has sparked an interest to other drivers. My goal is to make drivers successful. Pacific Tank Lines has provided an excellent opportunity to become a trainer!"



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CTA Championships

On April 26th 2014 the California Trucking Association held its annual truck driving championships. Established in California by the California Trucking Association in 1948, the California Truck Driving Championships provide the professional truck driver an opportunity to demonstrate the talent and skills that have made them a leader in their profession. The two main objectives of the truck driving championships are to provide a safety incentive program for professional truck drivers based on driving skill and knowledge of highway safety; and to improve media and general public image of truck drivers and the motor carrier industry. This year there were 9 divisions and 357 drivers competing. This year Pacific Tank Lines, Inc. entered six of our drivers into the competition; Anthony Macias (2nd place winner last year 2013 -Colton), Larry Woods (senior driver/ trainer Colton), Albert Onzures (driver/ trainer Colton), Juan Elizalde (driver/Colton), Charles Holdren (driver/Colton), and Larry Fisher (senior driver/ trainer San Diego). Each year the course is changed and has different elements to the competition. Drivers were scored on problems on the course, testing their ability to maneuver their vehicle through scenarios designed to simulate conditions that truck drivers encounter in everyday operations. This year Juan Elizalde won 3rd place in the Tanker Division! This was his first time entering the competition. Juan will now advance to the State Finals competition on May 18 in Sacramento.
